Letters to Church Leaders

1-2 Timothy; Titus

STORY POINT: PAUL TOLD CHURCH LEADERS TO TRUST AND OBEY GOD.

The early church grew, spreading out in different cities as more and more people heard the gospel and trusted in Jesus. The believers met together, and leaders taught them about God and about how Christians should live.

Paul wrote letters to some of the leaders in the church. Two of these leaders were Timothy and Titus.

In his letter to Timothy, Paul reminded him not to let anyone look down on him because he was young. Paul said, "Be an example of what a believer says and does."


Being a leader in the church is not easy. Paul told Timothy that God had chosen him to lead. Paul wrote, "Do not be afraid to suffer for the Lord."

When Paul wrote to Titus, he explained why believers should live in a way that pleases God.

Paul explained that God is gracious to sinners. God gave us what we do not deserve when He provided the way for people to be saved from sin. Because of this, we want to do what is right. We want to live in ways that please God.




